August 26, or previously, nominating petitions for Congress in districts in more than one county shall be filed with the Secretary of State; August 20, or previously, petitions for Congress in districts wholly in a single county shall be filed with the county clerk, on or before the same date petitions for State Senator, members of Assembly and county officers shall be filed with the county clerk.

September 1, terms of office of district boards of registry and election begin, vacancies to be filled within 3 days thereafter. September 3, district boards of election organize. September 4, nominating petitions for municipal officers shall be filed. September 12, time limit for filing names of vacancies on primary election tickets. September 13, date set for completion of house-to-house registration canvass in municipalities of 10,000 or less. On this date county boards of election sit for the purpose of revising and correcting the primary registry lists. September 19, time limit for primary campaign contributions. September 21, time limit for filing primary expense statements.

September 24 primary election held. September 25, clerks of boards of registry and election shall post corrected lists of names of persons entered on registry. September 26, or previously, state committees issue call for state conventions. September 28, annual meetings of county committees. October 1, state conventions of parties in Trenton.

October 4, or previously, petitions contesting nominations, or election to any party position, shall be filed. October 8, time limit for filing state, county and city committee expense statements. October 9, time limit for payment of candidates' expense bills. October 14, time limit for filing campaign managers' statement of expenses. October 16, time limit for filing declarations of candidates. October 21, time limit for filing vacancies, on general election tickets. October 22, time limit for filing affidavits of voters unable to register personally. October 24, time limit for holding meetings of county boards of canvassers to canvass the soldier vote. October 31, time limit for contributions to campaigns of candidates. October 31 and November 2, county boards of elections sit from 8 a. m. till 5 p. m. to add names to and erase names from registry lists. November 2, time limit for filing of campaign managers' financial statements. November 4, Courts of Common Pleas to sit to revise and correct registry lists. November 5, election day, Courts of Common Pleas to sit to inquire into legality of persons registered and revise and correct registry lists in municipalities of 10,000 or less.

November 11, county boards of elections meet to canvass vote; November 15, time limit for applications for recount; November 20, time limit for payment of candidates' expense bills; November 25, time limit for filing campaign managers' statements of receipts and liabilities; November 26 or previously, State board of canvassers meet at Trenton to canvass

Congressional and United States Senatorial Vote; December 5, time limit for filing petitions contesting result of election; also time limit for meetings of county boards of canvassers to canvass soldier vote.
